Boosting jobs, growth and investment is one of the main priorities of the European Union. In line with this goal, the European Commission considers entrepreneurship to be a powerful tool in getting Europe growing again and increasing the number of jobs without creating new debt.

Social entrepreneurs and social enterprises are drivers of change that operate on the basis of viable business models. Social enterprises develop innovative approaches, models or practices for resolving societal challenges in an entrepreneurial way to promote inclusive, socially fair and environmentally sustainable economic development and social change. Their economic operations cover a broad spectrum of activities including, among others, social and economic integration of services for vulnerable and most-at-risk persons, social services of general interest, reducing greenhouse gas emissions and wastes, or producing renewable energy.









Thus, social enterprises can help meeting the Europe 2020 targets for employment, R&D / innovation, climate change / energy, education and poverty/social exclusion

However, lack of or poor access to finance is still perceived as one of the most significant barriers for starting up a social enterprise, ensuring its sustainability and growth. The funding system for social enterprises is underdeveloped in relation to the one used by other businesses and the demand of social enterprises for capital is not met in most parts of Europe.







OBJECTIVES

- To contribute to the development of a social finance market by enabling more social enterprises to take on repayable finance for developing and scaling up their innovative business model.
- Disseminate examples of new feasible, suitable and reliable financial instruments, hybrid finance packages, and investment and financial funds in social enterprises throughout Spain and Europe.
- Encourage networking between the main actors of the social finance market in Europe, public administrations, and social entrepreneurs, etc., and also, learn from different models and good practice in developing and enhancing social finance across the Union, through organized sharing and disseminating of expertise and experience, and through presenting practical examples that demonstrate how to effectively invest in or complement suitable financial products.
- Disseminate successful social entrepreneurship and social innovation experiences implemented in the most sparsely populated European areas.

Colloquium



Julio Llamazares, was born in 1955 in Vegamián, León Province, a village which has disappears 14 years later under the waters of a dam. Llamazares is a law graduate but left law for literature and journalism. He has written novel, poetry, essays, movie scripts, travel books... His work is tied to the land (nature), narrated with precision and an exquisite care of the descriptions. Is the author of works like La lluvia amarilla (Yellow rain), El cielo de Madrid (Madrid's sky) or Distintas formas de mirar el agua (Different way of looking at water). Nowadays, he is writing a weekly column in the newspaper 'El País'.



Sergio Del Molino (Madrid, 1979) emerged in the Spanish literary scene in 2013 with his novel "La hora violeta" (The violet hour), in which he narrates the death of his son Pablo, and with what he obtains excellent critics and comments. Del Molino was chosen this year, as one of the best Spanish writers under 40 years. Three years later, Del Molino returns even stronger to the first pages of culture with his work 'La España vacia" (The empty Spain), an essay about the population imbalance in Spain and the differences between the rural and the urban world. As a journalist, Del Molino collaborates in various media, like 'Heraldo de Aragón'.



José Ángel González Sainz (born in Soria, 1956) is a novelist, essayist, teacher and a translator. For many years, he has been working in Trieste (Italy), although now resides in Soria. He has obtained the award Anagrama and Castile and León's literature award. Is the author of half a dozen novels, of which his capital work would be Volver al mundo (Back to the world), which takes place in a place named El valle, in an area of Soria province and it's about the disenchantment of a young nihilists group that meet after many years.



Roberto Ortega (Soria, 1963) is a journalist. He is currently Head of Communication at Cives Mundi, El Hueco and Huertos de Soria. Roberto Ortega has made his career in Soria, where he was editor-in-chief and deputy director of the newspaper 'Heraldo de Soria', and for which he continues to collaborate as a regular columnist. He also collaborates with Cadena Ser and Onda Cero, two Spanish radios.

HOW TO ARRIVE

BY PLANE

To arrive to Soria from Adolfo Suárez Airport - Madrid Barajas there is a bus stop of ALSA Company that picks you up right at the T4.

You can arrive by plane to Madrid to any terminal, and in each of them, there are some airport buses that will take you from one terminal to another. There is a stop in T4, which is indicated. The bus makes its stop and takes the traveler to the bus station of Soria, without the need to go to the bus station in Madrid centre. It is a comfort.

BY TRAIN

If you want to come to Soria in a more comfortably way and you prefer the train, you can only access to Soria by this means of transport if you come from Madrid.

The train leaves from Madrid Chamartin station. Station Address: Calle Agustín de Foxa s / n 28036 Madrid (Madrid).

In this link you can check the schedules: http://www.renfe.com/. You just have to put the date, select "One way and / or Round trip" and the information will be at your fingertips.

HOW TO ARRIVE

BY CAR

If you come from Valladolid and you want to take the car, you should take the road N-122 and you must follow the signs. The estimated travel time is about 2h 30min. Conversely, if you prefer coming from Madrid, you should take the A-2 and A-15 road or A-1 and N-110 road and you must follow the signs. The estimated travel time is about 2h 15min.

If you come from Barcelona, you should take the AP-2 or A-2 road and you must follow the signs. The estimated travel time is about 4h 25min.

However, if you come from Zaragoza, you should take the AP-68 and N-122 road; the A-2 and N-234 road or AP-68 road and you must follow the signs. The estimated travel time is about 1h 50min.

BY BUS

On the other hand, if you prefer travelling in a more convenient way and you want to come by bus, here are several possibilities:

If you proceed from Madrid, there are several schedules. The station from where these buses leave is Avenida de América Station. You can check here the bus schedule: http://www.alsa.es/. You just have to put the date, select "One way and / or Round trip" and the information will be at your fingertips. The bus station is located at: Avenue América 9 28002 Madrid (Madrid). It is accessible by underground lines 4, 6, 7 and 9. However if you proceed from Zaragoza there is also an extense schedule. The station where you can take these buses it is Delicias Station. There are two different of companies: Linecar or Therpasa.
